Highlights of the Week

- CHMSU President Norberto Mangulabnan attended the formal installation of Boyet Batang as the 7th President of Isabela State University at the ISU Echague Main Campus on January 28, 2026. President Mangulabnan delivered a message of support as PASUC National Vice President for the Visayas. He was accompanied by Vice President for Research, Extension, and Intellectual Property Ma. Riza Manalo and CIER staff Michael Franz Durano.
- The CHMSU community gathered at the Talisay (Main) Campus Dining Hall on January 29, 2026, for a reorientation on the Ecological Waste Management System (EWMS) Policy. Led by CIER Director Rhoderick Samonte, the session brought together pollution control officers, JPA personnel, student organizations, and staff from the General Services Unit and Business Affairs Office to strengthen awareness and accountability in managing campus waste.
