The 2022 campaign will highlight the strides made in anti-VAW efforts in line with the Philippines' 20th year of participation in the 16 Days of Activism Against Gender-Based Violence. In 2002, the Philippine government joined this global campaign with the call to action to immediately pass the Anti-Trafficking in Persons Act. Republic Act 9208 was enacted in 2003. The succeeding years of the campaign became instrumental in advocating for

the passage of other anti-VAW and promoting laws or popularizing the same. This includes the enactment of the Anti-Violence Against Women and Their Children Act or RA 9262 in the year 2004, the adoption of RA 9208 and RA 9262 Implementing Rules and Regulations, and the of Inter-Agency creation Councils and Committees and the



national, regional, and local levels to oversee the popularization and implementation of the laws.
