- AACCUP Level III Phase 2 Survey Visit** in Binalbagan Campus of the six programs was completed on August 29-31, 2022 via Zoom platform. The programs covered were Bachelor of Elementary Education, Bachelor of Secondary Education, Bachelor of Science in Business Administration, Bachelor of Science in Criminology, Bachelor of Science in Fisheries and Bachelor of Science in Information Technology. This was followed by the AACCUP Level III Phase 2 Survey Visit in the Alijis Campus on August 31-September 2, 2022 via Zoom platform which covered four programs under the College of Education, College of Industrial Technology and College of Computer Studies.
- The Stakeholders Orientation on the Conduct of Face-to-Face Classes for AY 2022-2023** was held last August 31, 2022 via Zoom and Facebook Live. Vice President for Academic Affairs Jay B. Estrellas, EdD discussed guidelines and updates on the conduct of face-to-face classes as well as

Develop a Passion to Make a Difference

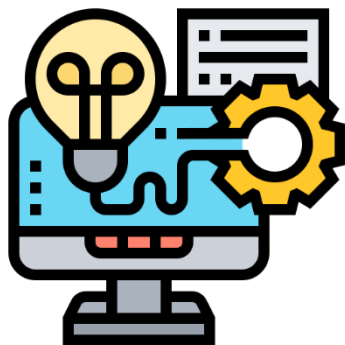
