## FIRE SAFETY TIPS AT HOME

**PLACE THE NEAREST PHONE NUMBERS OF THE NEAREST FIRE STATION RIGHT BESIDE YOUR TELEPHONE.**

You should also save the numbers in your mobile phone.



**ELIMINATE COMBUSTIBLE MATERIALS THROUGH GOOD HOUSEKEEPING.**

Dispose wastes such as papers, rubbish and other materials that can easily be caught by fire.



**KEEP MATCHES OUT OF CHILDREN'S REACH.**

Put them in a high place away from your children's sight.



**DO NOT KEEP FLAMMABLE MATERIALS INSIDE THE HOUSE.**

Store them in a safe and dry location. Make sure to properly label them where you will put it as flammable products.



**REGULARLY CHECK YOUR ELECTRICAL INSTALLATIONS BY A LICENSED ELECTRICIAN.**

You can schedule it annually, or if you notice any irregularities. Make sure electrical cords are not running under carpets or across doorways.



**DO NOT OVERLOAD ELECTRICAL CIRCUITS.**

Most homes use extension cords so they can use several devices at the same time. But you should avoid this practice because it may cause the sockets to overheat and possibly cause fire.



**NEVER LEAVE A LIT CIGARETTE OR CIGAR ON PIPE UNATTENDED.**

It may fall on flammable materials like clothes, curtains, furniture, appliances as well as items that are made by paper, wood, plastic and rubber.
