- Carlos Hilado Memorial State University kicked off the **CHMSUan Fresher’s Week 2022 with a General Convocation and Student Orientation (for all Students)** on September 5, 2022 at the Multi-purpose Gym, Talisay Campus. The event was hosted by the Office for Student Affairs, led by its Director Janet P. Espinosa, PhD. This was the first face-to-face orientation after two years of quarantine due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The event was simultaneously aired via CHMSU Student Affairs and Services Facebook Page.
- As part of the CHMSUan Fresher’s Week, a series of campus tours was given from September 6-7, 2022. Groups of incoming first year students, transferees and returnees were guided around their respective campuses and shown the different facilities

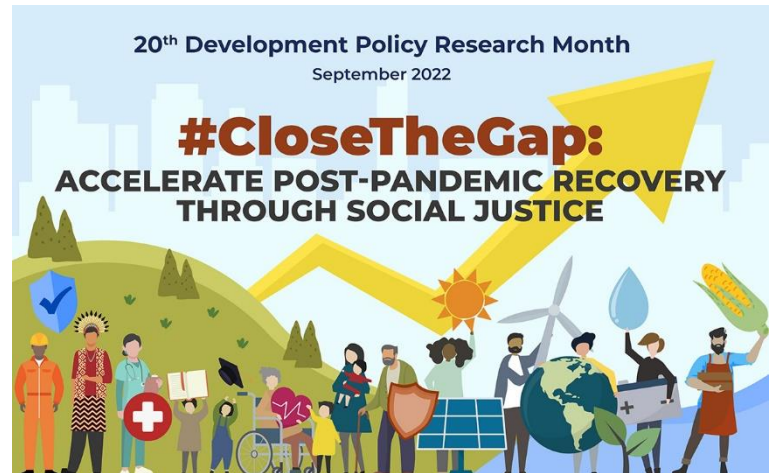
- and offices while being given quick overviews of the services offered by each.

A brief program was held for student officers to introduce their clubs and invite new members to join.
- Carlos Hilado Memorial State University GAD Focal Point System (GFPS) hosted the GAD Consultative Meeting on September 8, 2022 at the Function Hall, Green Building, Talisay (Main) Campus. This meeting was initiated by CHEDRO VI in line with the preparations for the Gender and Development (GAD) Plan and Budget (GPB) by the State Universities and Colleges (SUCs). Other related concerns and



issues were also tackled. GAD Focal Persons of the SUCs in Western Visayas participated in the meeting.

The last day of the workshop will be held on September 12, 2022.



Proclamation No. 247, issued by Malacañang in September 2002, declared the month of September of every year as Development Policy Research Month (DPRM). It highlights the critical role of policy research in the socioeconomic advancement of the Philippines.

The observance of the DPRM is intended to cultivate a strong culture of research and use of data and evidence among the country's national and local decisionmakers in policymaking and program planning. Through the different topics highlighted in every DPRM celebration, this event also aims to raise the public's literacy of important socioeconomic issues.

This year's DPRM celebration carries the theme, "#CloseTheGap: Accelerate Post-pandemic Recovery through Social Justice", or in Filipino, "#AlisinAngAgwat: Pabilisin ang Pag-ahon Mula sa Pandemya sa Pamamagitan ng Katarungang Panlipunan" to underscore the importance of making social justice a guiding principle of the country's post-pandemic recovery plan, particularly in three areas: human capital development and social protection, public health services and infrastructure, and environmental resilience.

Pursuant to Presidential Proclamation No. 1050, series of 1997 declaring the month of September as the Civil Service Month, the Civil Service Commission (CSC) is spearheading the celebration of the 122nd Anniversary of the Philippine Civil Service in 2022. This is in observance of the establishment of the Philippine Civil Service by virtue of Public Law No. 5 (An Act for the Establishment and Maintenance of an Efficient and Honest Civil Service in the Philippine Islands) on 19 September 1900.

In 2021, CSC introduced a 10-year overarching theme, Transforming Public Service in the Next Decade: Honing Agile and Future-Ready Servant-Heroes. The theme reflects the collective experience of the government workforce in the new normal, and in pushing for digital transformation and innovations to uphold public service excellence and continuity.

This year, the thematic focus is on resilience, which is part of building smart organizations and a future-ready civil service. Resilience has been shown by the civil service during the pandemic crisis in its readiness to accept challenges and ability to give continued assistance to the public.
