Highlights of the Week

CYBER SECURITY TIPS

NATIONAL CYBERSECURITY AWARENESS MONTH

Protecting yourself online at home and work is as important as ever, but understanding HOW can be confusing. Try our favorite security tips today to ensure your personal and employer's data stays secure.

TRY THESE TODAY

1 Use Multi-factor Authentication (MFA)
 MFA is an effective way to reduce the risk of someone breaking into your account.
 Download the **FREE “Microsoft Authenticator”** app and/or the **“Google Authenticator”** for Android and iOS.

Do not reuse passwords
 Having **unique passwords** for all of your account will reduce the risk and damage a hacker can do on your account.

3 Pay attention to the website address
 Phishing websites are becoming more sophisticated and have a similar appearance to real websites.
Do not enter your credentials without verifying the website address.

4 Update your computer's operating system
 Ensuring your Windows, MacOS, iOS and Android devices are **up to date with the latest security patches** is essential to ensure your device isn't targeted with a known exploit.

5 Beware of tech support scams
 These are pop-ups that randomly show up while web browsing telling the user that their system is compromised.
Do not call the number showing up on the screen.

Do not rush to send gift cards when asked in an email
Always question emails asking for gift cards or money transfers. Threat actors often spoof the boss's email to pressure targeted employees into buying them gift cards.
 If you know the person asking for gift cards, **contact them directly. Do not reply** to the same email.
