Highlights of the Week

- Faculty members successfully complete the 3-day training workshop given by Hinoki Global Concepts Inc. on the use of different equipment and machineries at the NOCDELIGHT Fabrication Laboratory, Talisay (Main) Campus. The workshop was held on September 8, 9, and 12, 2022 and was organized by the Center for External Affairs in line with the partnership agreement between CHMSU and the Department of Trade and Industry in the operations and management of the Shared Service Facility.
- The Department of Health Western Visayas Center for Health Development (DOH WV CHD) - National Tuberculosis Control Program (NTP) in partnership with the Philippine Business for Social Progress (PBSP) held the iDOTS Phase II Mentoring Activity from September 12-14, 2022 at the Function Hall, Green Building, Talisay (Main) Campus. The activity was conducted with speaker Dr. Gail Anne Madalag, NTP Medical Coordinator of the Cadiz City Health Office and Co-Chair of the Regional TB Medical Advisory Committee.
- On September 13, 2022, the Federation of Student Government and Social Science Guild held the ASEAN Battle of the Brains, an inter-college quiz bowl, at the Multi-purpose Gym, Talisay (Main) Campus. Student

representatives from the different colleges across the four campuses tested their knowledge on ASEAN Politics, Culture, and History for a grand prize of P3,000 in cash and other prizes. The College of Arts and Sciences went home as the Champion, followed by the College of Computer Studies and College of Education, ranking 1st Runner-up and 2nd Runner-up respectively.

- The Philippine Reef and Rainforest Conservation Foundation, Inc. held its National Closing Event of the Rethinking Plastics Project in the Philippines on September 14-15, 2022. This aimed to summarize the results and discuss the potentials of the project which was initiated to promote a circular economy for plastics and the reduction of marine litter in the Philippines. Center for External Affairs Director Rhoderick K. Samonte participated as the representative of the University. The first day in the Iloilo City Convention Center featured presentations and discussions on advisory services and pilot projects in the topics of EPR, plastic waste management, sustainable consumption, and production of plastics, as well as addressing sea-based sources of marine litter. On day two, the participants were invited to a learning visit in Bacolod City to explore partner MSMEs and celebrate the successes of their plastic waste reduction initiatives and share best practices.



✚ An Institutional Faculty Assembly and Orientation was held on September 15, 2022, at the Multi-purpose Gym, CHMSU Talisay (Main) Campus. The assembly kicked off with a presentation of faculty members and welcome remarks from University President Norberto P. Mangulabnan, PhD. A video message from Atty. Karlo Alexei B. Nograles, Chairman of the Civil Service Commission, was also shown. The assembly covered reports from the offices of the different Vice Presidents and updates on NBC 461, SUC Leveling, and IPCR. This was followed by an open forum where members of the faculty were able to ask questions and express concerns directed to the different administrators present.

✚ The College of Education Student Executive Council held its election of officers for AY 2022-2023 at the Function Hall, Green Building, Talisay (Main) Campus on September 15, 2022. Around 500 students from the different majors participated in the activity.

✚ Research and Development Services, headed by its director Leah L. Fernandez, PhD, conducted the Agency In-House Review for Completed Researches on September 16, 2022. After the opening program at the Function Hall, Green Building, Parallel Sessions in assigned venues were facilitated for the review of research on Education, ICT and Technology, Management and Social Sciences, and Natural Sciences and Fisheries. This activity is in line with the University's Research Agenda which prioritizes Integrated Basic Research for Education, Arts and Sciences, Synergy of Technology and Engineering, Fisheries and Aquaculture, Disaster Risk Reduction and Climate Change Adaptation, and Business and Management.

✚ The Dental Health Services conducted a free dental assessment for all "Pamilyahanong Yuhom" beneficiaries at the CHMSU Binalbagan Campus Clinic on September 16, 2022. This was its 3rd community service activity for the campus.

✚ Center for External Affairs Director Rhoderick K. Samonte attended the first Provincial Integrated Water Security Council Meeting of Negros Occidental on September 16, 2022 at Seda Capitol Central, Bacolod City. This meeting, presided over by Negros Occidental Governor Hon. Eugenio Jose V. Lacson, was initiated in order to review EO 22-12 Creating the PIWS Council and Salient Provisions as well as discuss the proposed Negros Occidental 2023-2030 Provincial Integrated Water Security Plan.

6 Crime Prevention Tips in your community or in your home



1. Get to know your neighbors and all those residing in your street. They will be your partners in watching the activities in your block.

2. Organize a Street Watch composed of neighbors as members. Be concerned and cooperate in watching activities on the block and reporting unusual or suspicious behavior to the police and the Street Watch Officer.



3. Exchange names, home and work telephone numbers among members. Prepare diagram of the block or neighborhood where you belong for easy identification of households in case an emergency or crime incident occurs. The diagram should contain the house number, telephone numbers and occupants' names. The emergency and police department telephone numbers should be included in the diagram.

4. Look after you neighbor's house when he is away and ask him to look after yours. This includes collecting your mail, newspapers and other deliveries which would indicate at a glance that no one is home.



5. Attend meetings called by your Street Watch Officer. Find out about the crime situation in your area and what you can do about them. Share information and experiences with your neighbors.

6. Get to know your police chief and members of the police station in your area. Write down the station's emergency hotline number in a place you can easily see in case you will need police advise or assistance. Use your police force – they are ready, willing, and able to keep you, your family and your neighborhood safe and sound. Source: pro10.pnp.gov.ph
