Gender discrimination has far-reaching and profound effects on the lives of women and girls.

<p style="text-align: center;">NATIONALITY</p> <p style="text-align: center;">In more than 50 countries, women are denied the right to acquire, change or retain their nationality</p> <p>IMPACT: Inability to confer and exercise the same nationality rights as men, such as the right to education, healthcare, property ownership, freedom of movement, political participation and employment.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">EMPLOYMENT</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Women earn 23% less than men globally</p> <p>IMPACT: Higher incidence of poverty and more vulnerable to external shocks; more likely to concentrate in lower paid, insecure employment; lower propensity to save and invest.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">FAMILY</p> <p style="text-align: center;">In 29 out of 187 countries, husbands are the legally designated heads of households</p> <p>IMPACT: Husbands control key family decisions and official documents. In some cases, they can restrict the wife's right to work or open a bank account.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">SEXUAL ORIENTATION & GENDER IDENTITY</p> <p style="text-align: center;">68 countries criminalize same-sex relationships</p> <p>IMPACT: Increased vulnerability to violence; arbitrary arrest and detention; violations of the right to privacy and non-discrimination.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">EDUCATION</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Globally, 750 million adults are illiterate. Two thirds of them are women.</p> <p>IMPACT: Wide ranging effects from reduced access to economic and productive resources to poorer health and well-being; and greater barriers to engagement in decision-making spheres.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">UNPAID CARE & DOMESTIC WORK</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Women spend 3x as many hours as men each day in unpaid care and domestic work.</p> <p>IMPACT: Less time for paid work, education and leisure, further reinforcing gender-based social and economic structures.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">INTIMATE PARTNER VIOLENCE</p> <p style="text-align: center;">1 in 3 women worldwide have experienced physical or sexual violence – mostly by an intimate partner</p> <p>IMPACT: Deleterious impact on the lives and health of women; significant socioeconomic implications for individuals, families, communities and societies.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">FEMALE GENITAL MUTILATION</p> <p style="text-align: center;">1 in 3 girls, aged 15-19, have experienced FGM in the 30 countries where the practice is most prevalent</p> <p>IMPACT: Severe emotional and physical trauma; potential health risks, including reproductive and sexual health complications, and possible death through loss of blood or sepsis.</p>
